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Genealogical Principles Course

Build a strong foundation in genealogy research. Ideal for anyone from beginners to seasoned researchers without on-site experience, the Genealogical Principles Course ensures you have the practical skills to search records, interpret information, and resolve basic identity questions.

Over seven weeks, you will:

- Improve your genealogical research skills
- Gain a solid understanding of genealogical concepts and terms
- Master the Genealogical Proof Standard
- Learn to locate and search public records to resolve identity problems
- Understand the basics of DNA and ethnicity

With **six starts** each year, there are frequent opportunities to enroll in this course.

Curriculum

Week One

Define genealogy and then study elements of the Genealogical Proof Standard (GPS) to determine how your identity is contextually derived from information, sources, and evidence.

Week Two

What data from popular websites should we trust? Learn to recognize and analyze conflicting information.

Week Three

Work with a published document and test whether it meets the GPS. Learn to correlate information to resolve identity problems.

Week Four

What elements make up a good proof argument? Examine and analyze a well-cited article that meets all standards.

Week Five

What can you learn from free and paid websites? Discuss an identity problem and its solution with records created by formerly enslaved people after the Civil War.

Week Six

Develop timelines, design a research plan, and evaluate a written report to see if it meets standards.

Week Seven

Gain insight into DNA and ethnicity, then compare the major genetic genealogy testing companies to choose the one whose results correspond to a given research project.





Genealogical Practicum Course

Elevate your expertise through hands-on research. The Genealogical Practicum Course is designed for experienced genealogists looking to refine their practice. Using real case studies, this course will help you improve your research techniques, write genealogical documents, and gain deeper insight into the field.

Over seven weeks, you'll hone your ability to:

- Plan strategic research
- Document your research and write high-quality reports
- Develop genealogical work products
- Compile family histories
- Prepare proof discussions

Curriculum: Genealogical Practicum Course

The Genealogical Practicum Course consists of five unique research cases spanning different geographic areas, time periods, and ethnicities. During each ten-day module, students will put the research skills they've learned into practice and develop a specific written work product. If you reenroll, you can change the cases you work through.

Case One: Research Planning

Learn how to approach a research problem by analyzing the starting information, identifying available resources, and then developing a comprehensive plan with specific details about the sources to be searched.

Case Two: Research Logs

Understand how to methodically record information about the collections and sources you examined, the information they yielded, and the contextual relevance of that source to a research problem.

Case Three: Genealogical Compilations

Explore how genealogical compilations organize familial relationships and document kinship, then perform research to place individuals correctly within a family and produce a genealogical summary of your work.

Case Four: Proof Discussions

Learn strategies for developing proof discussions. You will then work on a case that requires you to construct a proof argument to answer the research question.

Case Five: Research Reports

Understand best practices for genealogical research reports, then resolve a case by presenting evidence and conclusions in report format.

Genealogy Research Certificate

Prerequisite: Participants must complete an assessment to ensure they have the skills and background knowledge to succeed in this course.

Master professional techniques that can help researchers prepare for certification through BCG or ICAPGen. The Genealogical Research Certificate provides the skills needed to perform high-level analysis, resolve challenging cases, and explore the complexities of this evolving field.

Over fifteen weeks, this certificate covers:

- Complex research planning
- Advanced analysis and correlation
- Formal standards of the genealogy field

With **three start dates** each year, you can enroll in this course at the time that's most convenient for you. Note that interested students must take a placement assessment to evaluate their readiness for the course.

Curriculum: Genealogical Research Certificate

Many students have found this rigorous certificate to be excellent preparation for certification through the Board for Certification of Genealogists® (BCG) or accreditation with the International Commission for the Accreditation of Professional Genealogists (ICAPGen).

Module 1: Genealogical Methods

Explore tools and techniques for addressing complex genealogical challenges, with a focus on logical reasoning, the research cycle, uncovering identities, and making generational connections.

Module 2: DNA as a Genealogical Source

Gain deep insight into DNA evidence and how it can be used to resolve genealogical questions, including issues related to Y-chromosome DNA (Y-DNA) and mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA), the ethics of DNA testing, and maternal and paternal haplogroups.

Module 3: Evidence, Evaluation, and Documentation

Examine the importance of properly evaluating and documenting evidence to avoid inaccurate conclusions, flawed citations, and dead ends in your research.

Module 4: Genealogical Writing

Understand the vital role of narrative organization and writing in the research process. You will gain experience with formats and objectives for all three primary genealogical work products: research reports, proof arguments, and narrative compilations.

Module 5: Forensic Genealogy

Explore the ethical parameters of this lucrative specialty by working with real-world forensic genealogy cases. Activities include tracing heirs for probate, locating living individuals, and identifying unknown parentage through autosomal DNA.
